## **Higher Education to Rural Students**

#### Goal

The aim of the institution is to enhance the higher education facility to the rural students those who are from socially and economically backward from the society.

Higher education is still accessible only to the urban students. Only few of rural people choose and opted for higher education. Most of the students are far away from the institution. Huge amount of fees, lack of awareness are the big obstacles for them to carry out their higher education.

Especially rural women students are not allowed to continue their studies after intermediate. This is mainly due to distance for travelling from their home places to educational institutions and lack of protection to them. The college goal is to offer the UG & PG education to the rural people hence the management take concrete steps to open PG courses to facilitate the unprivileged sections of the society.

#### **The Context**

The college planned to provide facility to the students from the various areas in and around the college. There is number of villages in and around the college. There are underdeveloped villages are there. Most of the villages have not intermediate colleges in their own villages.

#### **The Practice**

The following activities are taken by the college to widen the access of higher education to the rural students.

1. The faculty from the various departments consults intermediate student's parents to specify the need of studying UG & PG courses.

2. The college deals state government rules learning reservation of seats.

**3.** The institution arranged scholarship facility from government for economically weaker students to carry out their higher education without financial problem.

4. The college has followed uniform system to all students both for UG and PG course. This will facilitate equal treatment of all students irrespective of their community, financial status, etc.

However some of the limitations are even we offer higher education to the rural people. We should follow government reservation system in admission process.

College is self financing more hence it does not have huge economic resources.

#### Problem encountered and reserve reg.

1. The main object of the college is to offer higher education to rural students, the entry of students is low in the admission is full sanctioned strength of students with lower marks are also admitted.

- 1. It is difficult to get private scholarship. The college offers the scholarship only from the government but every year students facing financial difficulties. Scholarship given by the government only to particular community alone. Even other backward community not able to obtain scholarship from the government.

#### 2. Goal

### 3. The Context:

Plastics pose a significant threat to our earth. The very qualities that make it an adaptable and durable product to use also make plastic an environmental nightmare. Plastics do not biodegrade. They are buried deep in landfills and leak harmful chemicals that spread into groundwater. <u>Floating plastic waste</u>, which can survive for thousands of years in water, serves as mini transportation devices for invasive species, disrupting habitats. Chemicals added to plastics are absorbed by human bodies. Some of these compounds have been found to alter hormones or have other potential human health effects.

#### 4. Practice:

As a part of social responsibility, an awareness programme on "Say No to Plastic" was conducted. Faculty, Staff and Students of the College went on an anti-plastic campaign through the streets of Naraini, sensitizing people about the ill-effects of plastics. They collected plastic bottles & bags. The team went on to explain why plastic causes contamination and is non-ecological. They urged residents to avoid using plastic bottles & bags. Banners with slogans and pictures, pamphlets addressing the need to act with social and moral responsibility were displayed around the area. This awareness was created not only within the campus but has reached a large audience.

#### 5. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

The awareness program, 'Say No to Plastics" had a lot of hurdles to go through. The NSS students played a significant role, who voluntarily went to the each inhabitant of Naraini Bus Stop, Railway Stations and all the public areas and did cleanliness drive through out Naraini, which resulted in good collection of Bottles & Bags needed for the awareness program.
